With the right side facing you, make a slip knot and place it on your crochet hook. Chain 2 (counts as 1 dc). Work 11 dc into the loop. Join with a slip stitch to the top of the first dc. (12 dc)

Row 2:

Chain 3 (counts as 1 dc). Work 2 dc into each dc around. Join with a slip stitch to the top of the first dc. (24 dc)

Row 3:

Chain 3 (counts as 1 hdc). Work 2 hdc into each dc around. Join with a slip stitch to the top of the first hdc. (48 hdc)

Row 4:

Chain 2 (counts as 1 sc). Work 1 sc into each hdc around. Join with a slip

stitch to the top of the first sc. (48 sc)

Row 5:

Chain 1. Work 1 sc into each sc around. Join with a slip stitch to the top of

the first sc. (48 sc)

Rows 6-12:

Repeat Row 5.

Handle:

Chain 20. Single crochet into the second chain from the hook and each

chain across. Turn your work and single crochet back across the row.

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

Finishing Touches:

1. Sew the handle to the sides of the basket.

2. Add any desired embellishments, such as ribbons, bows, or buttons.

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
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
