



Schindler's List (1993)






Spotlight (2015)

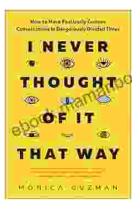
